What is the National Scouting Jamboree?

The National Jamboree occurs every 4 years and is a gathering of scouts from all over the world for fun, fellowship, adventure, and excitement!

The 2023 National Scout Jamboree will be held from July 19 to July 28, 2023 at Summit Bechtel National Scout Reserve in New River Gorge, WV. The Jamboree staff is expecting around 15,000 scouts to attend the event from every US state and several foreign countries.

Jamboree showcases the broad range of activities available within scouting. Those activities are conducted at many high-adventure venues found at the Summit Bechtel Reserve. Joe Ordoyne, head of the 2017 CNCC venture crew and veteran of several past Jamborees has described the National Jamboree as “Disney World for Boy Scouts” and “Scout camp on steroids.” Read on in this newsletter to learn

Jamboree Qualifications

Qualifications: To attend, a Scout must meet the following qualifications:

1. Scouts must be a registered scouter.
2. Scouts must have completed sixth grade or be at least 12 years of age by July 19, 2023 and have not reached their 18th birthday by July 28, 2023.
3. Venture Scouts must have completed the eighth grad or be at least 14 years of age by July 19, 2023 and
4. Participate in pre-jamboree training experiences (conducted by the Central N.C. Council).
5. Be approved by your Scoutmaster or Venture Advisor and the local Central NC Council Jamboree Committee.
6. Jamboree is a physically demanding experience with a great deal of walking

involved. A full physical will be required next spring, and it is HIGHLY recommended that all participants be capable of hiking 10+ miles a day with a light day pack.

Adventure Valley – The Zip

Soar through the trees on a series of zip lines 50 to 80 feet in the air. If you like going fast with a bird’s eye view, clip into one of five zip lines that zig and zag over Adventure Valley at the Summit. We’ll have miles and miles of aerial adventure — five parallel zip lines over a combined 3,000 feet long. Reach speeds of up to 50 MPH as you soar over The Summit on one of the

longest zip line courses in all of North America.

Adventure Valley will also be home to The Rocks (rock climbing), Low Gear (cross-country mountain biking), High Gear (downhill mountain biking), and lake kayaking.

The Canopy

Taking to the trees at The Summit is more than just zip lines. The Canopy is a tree-to-tree adventure that gives Scouts and Venturers a new way to connect with their environment. The journey combines the geology, history and topography of the region to create an exciting encounter — all while suspended far above the earth



Thrasher Mountain

Get ready to get your shred on at an X Games-quality skate park designed by Tony Hawk. Skateboarding at the Summit Bechtel Reserve offers something for every ability level - from beginner to seasoned thrasher. Build up your skill in the bowl, reach

new heights on the vert ramp, or grind out new combos street-style in the park. We’ve even got a foam pit for you to try tricks that really push your skill level.

At The Trax, participants will find the Summit’s

thrilling BMX and mountain board courses. A disc golf area will also be located a short stroll from The Trax.



Aquatics – Not Just for Swimming



Aquatics activities will be located at the Summit's man-made lakes (Goodrich Lake and Bravo Lake), as well as The Pools. Goodrich Lake will be home to fishing, basic kayaking, paddle boarding, and an expanded Water Reality obstacle course. Lake Bravo will be home to advanced kayaking. The Pools will be home to scuba diving staffed by Navy Seals and free swim.

Bravo Lake is also home to the water obstacle course, kayak touring and stand-up paddle boarding. It's a place where you can cool off between programs and enjoy the reflection of the natural beauty on its calm waters.

Bows and Barrels / Jamboree Trek / Day of Service / Stadium Show

Shooting sports at the 2023 Jamboree will offer the widest variety of shooting sports activities ever: shotguns, rifles, pistols, 3-D archery, and sporting arrows. You've never seen archery quite like this! The Summit will feature traditional training with bows, but Scouts and Venturers will be able to try something completely new: sporting arrows. Much like the shotgun sport, this archery activity will challenge you to hit moving targets as they launch through the air.

Also, for one day of the jamboree, each unit will hike to Garden Ground Mountain, the summit of the Summit. Upon reaching the top, hikers will take part in pioneering, buckskin games, Highland Games, and Native American and other historical activities.

Scouts will spend one day at the Summit Center stadium show (with celebrity guest speakers and music entertainment) as well as participate in the Messenger of Peace Day of Service project.



The Jamboree is a physically demanding experience. A number of our activities require more stamina and fitness, too—climbing, rappelling, rafting, mountain biking, and skateboarding. It is essential that all participants and staff are prepared.



National Registration – VERY IMPORTANT!!!

If you haven't already, you need to go online to jamboree.scouting.org and register your scout.

This must be done by each participant, and is separate from registering with the council.

- If your scout does not have an account on my.scouting.org, you will need to create one. Main piece of information you need is their scout ID. If you do not know it, the site will allow you to search for it based on personal info.
- It is recommended that you and your scout fill out this information together,
- as there are several waivers and releases they must agree to.
- Once you complete registration, print a copy of the message for your records (one should be emailed to you as well).
- Make note of the registration code on this page and forward it to stuart.williams@scouting.org to ensure he sees it.
- Parents will receive an email with a link to approve the waiver for anyone under the age of 18. You will need to click the link in the email and note your consent for your scout's application to be considered complete.
- The Council will then accept you into the Jamboree troop/crew.
- After registration you will be asked to submit A current, detailed health form and physical.

Financial Details and Uniform Requirements

The total cost for youth participants to attend with Central N.C. Council Jamboree Contingent will be \$2,400. This fee includes Jamboree program, transportation, meals, special Central N.C. Council items (only for participants), use of patrol and troop equipment, and all pre-Jamboree trainings.

- You should receive regular invoices beginning in late November. If you are not, or have questions about how much you currently owe, please email stuart.williams@scouting.org

- There is a 10% late fee for any payment balance past the due date. Address to mail payments is on page 6.
- If you are able to pay in advance, that is greatly appreciated. Council payments to National are due in March, and bills for supplies will begin to roll in, so a steady reserve is required to ensure we can pay our bills.
- What's included?
 - Transportation to and from Summit Bechtel National Scout Reserve in West Virginia, entrance into Jamboree, all meals for 10 days, program activities, patches, neckerchiefs, T Shirts, duffel bag, a day pack, and lots of other council and jamboree memorabilia.
 - Uniforms – each scout needs a new Class A shirt. The wicking version is preferred. We will provide Jamboree insignia for your uniform; all you need to buy is your rank patch.

Each Scout will need 2 Class A (Field) Uniforms, one of which should be new for Jamboree (the other can be your current uniform). Uniform Patches will be provided for your Jamboree uniform.

*If you registered prior to 10/31/22, final payment is only \$400
